## From the President

As part of the process of "crisping up" our vision and mission statements, changing our logo and signage, and revamping the website, I have been busy collecting stories from the various service lines around Elwyn. Beginning in this issue, I would like to share some of the family and consumer comments that I have encountered. The following is from the parent of Joey, a four-year old child with severe Autism. Joey participates in our Philadelphia Archworks program, which is part of the Early Childhood array of services we offer. Here's what Joey's mother had to say:

"In my eyes, Joey was lost in a world that was empty and dark. He could not see or hear me, which as a mother, made me feel empty inside. My son was alive, but not living. He showed little or no emotion to his family or anyone else. Joey walked over everything as if it didn't exist.

The Elwyn family at Archworks worked intensely with Joey and now he shows interest in the world around him and interest in me. Joey has learned to embrace me with hugs and kisses. Now a child who was silent babbles all day long, humming songs. He has even made progress with a communication device, and has learned a few words".

### Joey's not just a part of my life, I'm also a part of his.

"Joey even notices my absence and the best reward was the first time he said 'Mom.' I shared this moment with one of the most important people in my life, Judy from Archworks. She happened to be at the hospital with her daughter at the same time I was there with Joey. Joey had called for me when I was out of the area, and Judy searched to find me. When I saw so much emotion in his face, where there was once none, my emotions went wild. And then when he called out for the first time - 'Mom' - I was overjoyed.

I'm so proud of my son and appreciative of the staff from Archworks. If it weren't for your support, Joey would still be lost. For the first time I can say Joey's not just a part of my life, I'm also a part of his."

Elwyn is diverse in the services it offers and in the consumers it serves. I share this example of the wonderful work being accomplished every day at the Archworks program to show the tremendous impact it has had in the lives of Joey and his family. This is just one example of Elwyn's supportive community of caring maximizing potential, one individual at a time.

## Love and Limits Help a Young Boy Live More Independently

Rosita Padilla remembers fondly the teacher who complimented her son Jorge for being considerate to his classmates. As a young student, he would help the other children by zipping up their jackets and pushing in their chairs for them. This is the kind of memory a mother stores in her heart to console her when nothing else can.

For more often than not, Rosita has had to endure the harsh stares of judgmental strangers or take the dreaded phone calls from school asking her to pick up her disruptive son. She remembers the sunny days that quickly turned dark. Like the time at the Carnival when Jorge thrilled to the roller coaster ride and waited patiently for his next turn in line. Then, just like that, he grabbed and smelled the hair of the little girl in front of him, and the magical day was over. Apologies, explanations, abrupt departures. Life with Jorge was not easy for the Padilla family, and it was getting more difficult with each passing day.

Jorge Padilla is a "sweet kid" who suffers from Pervasive Development Disorder and Disruptive Behavior Disorder. He is mildly developmentally delayed and has difficulty communicating, exhibiting some of the traits attributed to autism. At 13, he looks like an average boy which is why his behavior in public is not always understood. His mother often finds herself on the defensive, trying to explain away his outbursts of obscenities, or the aggressive behavior that often deteriorates into pinching, punching and tantrums.

And then there's the string obsession. For some reason, Jorge found great comfort in holding a piece of string in his hands. He would strip all the family sneakers of their laces and throw tantrums

unless his father Jorge, Sr., ran out to the store and bought him new string. It became a battle of wills between the parents and son but somehow, Jorge always won.

Since 2004, Jorge has lived at Elwyn in Cottage 6, a Biopsychosocial Unit (BPSU) under the supervision of the Child Welfare/Juvenile Justice Division. His mother describes the decision to send him there as "the hardest thing I have ever done in my life."

"It still affects me to have my child away from me," she said. But much as she wants him home, she concedes that "we're not ready to take care of him at home, we're still not there."

But Rosita, husband Jorge and daughter Tina, 10, have seen extraordinary changes in Jorge

since he has been at Elwyn. When he visits home on weekends, they often hear him counting his numbers out loud as he lays in bed. To their delight, he can now dress himself, put on his shoes, hang up his clothes, shower and brush his own teeth. They are continually surprised that he can do so many things for himself.

At Elwyn, Jorge is always kept busy with chores, school, and activities to keep his attention focused and his routines more consistent. He approaches adults more easily and has made a new friend, but he is still working on improving his interaction with his peers whom he often alienates with teasing and inappropriate behavior. Elwyn has even managed to eliminate his string obsession while at Cottage 6, but he often carries a Matchbox car in its place and still asks for string on his visits home.

Elwyn has also counseled Jorge's parents to give them the tools they need to cope with his behavior and the understanding to see that his tantrums are the result of setting little or no boundaries. His parents are now challenging him more often even though this "tough love" approach is often hard for them and their son.

Rosita's dream is to see Jorge calm, in control of his behavior, and back in his own home. In the short term, her son will soon be moving from his 12-person cottage at Elwyn to a new small group home on campus where he and the three other boys residing with him will receive even more attention and gain even greater independence. Another big step in the right direction for a "sweet kid" supported by a lot of love.

## Biopsychosocial Unit Expanding on Campus

When Jorge Padilla moves into his new home in March, he will be the first of four teenage boys to occupy Quasar, formerly the Bratcher House, which is now a brand new on-site Biopsychosocial Unit (BPSU)



at Elwyn. Managed by Elwyn's Child Welfare/Juvenile Justice Division, the Biopsychosocial Program treats children in the Behavioral Health/

Mental Retardation programs diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders. The program has been expanding on campus at the request of Philadelphia and Chester County Behavioral Health Services.



In October, Elwyn converted the Family Training Center into a four-bed BPSU called Zenith for girls with significant behavioral

problems. The names of the two houses reflect the mission of both the program and Elwyn, to help each individual reach the pinnacle of success by maximizing their potential.

"We have always had 12 beds available for children requiring these services, but the need has always outstripped our capacity," said Susan Proulx,

Psy.D, Executive Director of the Child Welfare/Juvenile Justice Division. "The two new houses will allow us to help more children and we are committed to opening even more beds in these smaller, homelike settings."
