

Community Residential Rehabilitation Programs (CRR)

Elwyn operates two Community Residential Rehabilitation programs for people in recovery from mental illness. Located in Harrisburg and Philadelphia, these programs are designed to promote independent living, offer varied opportunities, and promote community inclusion.

We are committed to a holistic approach, embracing wellness and recovery principles. We empower our individuals to conquer their own challenges and to harness their own unique strengths. Residents learn how to identify resources, accept responsibility, and make appropriate choices, giving themselves the skills needed to realize their own personal potential.

- Each apartment provides a home-like atmosphere and is shared with a roommate.
- Rent fee is based on income.
- Staff is onsite 24 hours a day.
- All individuals are expected to participate in some type of activity outside of the residence, such as: employment, volunteer work, day program, clubhouse, etc.
- Program rules and expectations are reviewed with individuals and included in the Orientation Packet for new residents.
- Each applicant must have a mental health disability and be at least 18 years old.
- We provide support and encouragement towards the individual's own unique recovery.
- We teach independent living skills, such as: basic housekeeping, meal planning, cooking, food shopping, medication management/education, budgeting assistance, how to use public transportation, and appointment management.

Services provided:

- Social and recreational activities
- Groups
- Crisis intervention
- Goal planning, completed and reviewed every 60 days
- Contact with community liaisons
- Ongoing staff support
