- **Art Reach ACCESS Program**. If you have an access card, visit programs all around the city for \$2/ticket for up to 4 individuals. www.art-reach.org/access 
- **Elwyn Family Newsletter**. If your child is receiving early intervention services through Elwyn, you should receive a monthly email newsletter that includes a wide range of local resources and activities. If you did not receive it, ask your child’s Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to confirm your email address and send you a copy of the most recent newsletter.

I want my child to socialize with other children. What options are available?

Consider attending a local play group or area event with your child. This can be an easy way to see how they interact with same-age peers while continuing to have the support of your presence nearby.
