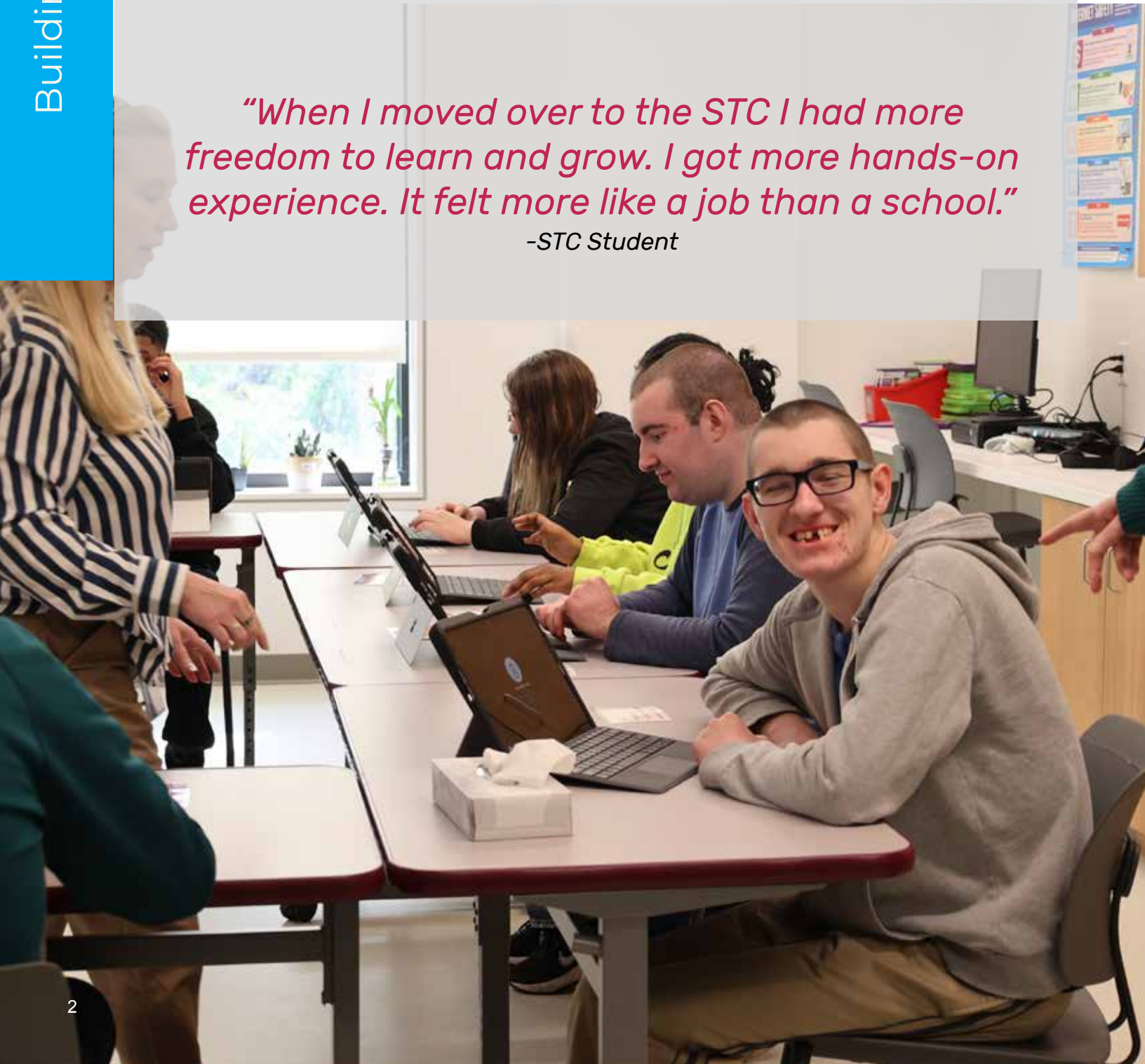
Student Transition Center

The Judy and Bill Strine Student Transition Center is helping our young adults aged 18-21 build the skills and confidence they need to take their next steps toward independence. Designed as a bridge between school and adult life, the center offers individualized support focused on job training, daily living skills, and community engagement.

Since its opening in April, students have gained meaningful hands-on experiences that prepare them for employment and greater self-sufficiency. Admin Building Tribute

For more than a century, the John F. Crampf Esq. Administrative Center at Elwyn has served as the cornerstone of Elwyn and the heart of its operations. Constructed in the mid-1800s, it stood as both a center for leadership and a symbol of Elwyn's pioneering commitment to supporting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Within its walls, professionals shaped programs, advanced inclusion, and expanded services to meet evolving needs. Generations of staff began their careers here, and countless students and families found hope and support. In recognition of its enduring impact, Elwyn honored the building's legacy in June with a special decommissioning ceremony, celebrating its vital place in our history.

As we look to the future, the new Elwyn School, which will rise on the site of the former Administration Building, represents both continuity and progress. Designed to help every student reach their full potential, it will feature modern classrooms, therapeutic spaces, accessible design, and advanced technology. While the building itself will be new, the heart of Elwyn will remain the same—grounded in compassion, excellence, and a deep commitment to the dignity and growth of every individual we serve.



Young Adult Residential Treatment Facility

Elwyn's Young Adult Residential Treatment Facility (YARTF) has become a transformative place of growth and healing for residents. In this specialized setting, young adults with complex behavioral health needs receive individualized care that meets them where they are—helping them build emotional stability, self-confidence, and essential life skills.

The supportive environment fosters meaningful progress, as residents learn to manage challenges, strengthen relationships, and take steps toward greater independence. For many, this residence represents the first time they've felt truly understood and equipped to envision a hopeful, self-directed future.

Average age of individual served: 22.87

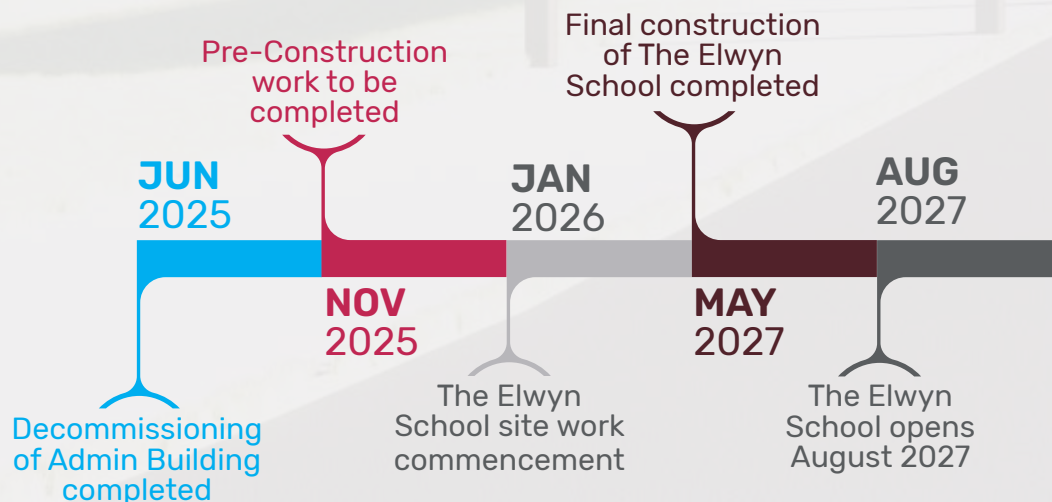


Master Campus Plan Update
